The event will be led by professional moderator Kris Covi, who will leverage his expertise as an industry attorney and event speaker to ensure seamless transitions between scheduled presentations and activities. Attendees will be presented an inspiring story by keynote speaker, Eric Giguere, who will



share his firsthand account and near-death experience as a survivor of a harrowing trench collapse in which he was buried alive. Participating presenters, including representatives from the Iowa Attorney General's office and Iowa One Call, will cover topics such as minimizing hazards, enhancing excavation safety, and the consequences of non-compliance with established requirements and best practices. The event will also feature the presentation of the Excavator and Locator of the Year Achievement Awards, acknowledging outstanding partners in damage prevention chosen by industry peers.



The decision to replace individual Excavation Safety Awareness Program (ESAP) meetings – previously held by Iowa One Call (IOC) in various locations across Iowa – follows the successful adoption by other states of full-day or multi-day "summit-style" programs. After observing the effectiveness of summit programs in neighboring states like Nebraska and Missouri, the IOC Board of Directors opted to initiate an Iowa summit event. Currently, IOC administrative staff, with support from IOC center vendor One Call Concepts (OCC), are developing the event. We're already seeing strong indications that the 2024 Iowa Excavation Safety Summit is generating significant anticipation.

One of the primary advantages of summit-style programs is the opportunity for collaboration and participation. Unlike individual meetings, where interaction may be limited, summits bring together stakeholders from various sectors of the industry. This diversity fosters rich discussions, the sharing of best practices, and the exploration of innovative solutions to common challenges. Attendees not only learn from expert presentations but also engage in meaningful dialogue with their peers, enriching their understanding and enhancing their professional networks.

Summit-style programs offer a broader and more complete educational experience compared to individual meetings and provide a wealth of information about current trends and the state of the industry. The attending exhibitor and participating sponsors provide attendees an interactive showcase of the latest tools, technologies and processes designed for safer, more efficient procedures that minimize risk and enhance productivity. ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION 2024 - GIVEAWAY EVENT






2024 ESAP VIA ZOOM

While our in-person Excavation Safety Awareness Program (ESAP) meetings will be replaced by the inaugural lowa Excavation Safety Summit going forward, we understand the value of continued engagement and accessibility. That's why lowa One Call will continue to offer virtual ESAP meetings as an option, ensuring that everyone has the opportunity to participate and stay up-to-date on the latest safety protocols and industry trends.

This year in March, we hosted three virtual ESAP meetings via Zoom. During each meeting, we played our pre-recorded safety presentation, held a Q&A session, and concluded with prize giveaways. We had **453** people pre-registered in total for the ESAP virtual meetings, with an average pre-registered of **151** people per meeting. One meeting reached **193** pre-registered attendees, which is considered a high volume for any virtual gathering.

We were thrilled to see the high attendance numbers for our virtual options – it shows there is certainly value in continuing to host these virtual ESAP meetings going forward. If you didn't make one of this year's virtual meetings, our ESAP presentations are posted on the <u>lowa One Call YouTube channel</u>. These videos are a great resource to have on hand for internal trainings or if you're simply looking to refresh on all things lowa One Call and damage prevention.


